

INCISION/SUTURES

- Most incisions need very little care. Slight redness and oozing of a watery, blood-tinged fluid is normal but should not last no more than 1-2 days.
- Use hydrogen peroxide to clean the incision, if necessary.
- Whenever possible our surgeons use dissolvable sutures, which do not require removal. They also serve to dramatically reduce licking and scratching of the incision area.
- If your animal has external sutures, they should be removed **10-14** days after surgery, unless told otherwise. A technician in our office can remove these. Please call to schedule an appointment.
- Licking and scratching of the incision site can and will cause delayed healing, infection, and may potentially necessitate further surgery. Please observe closely for excessive licking- this is especially true in canine neuters of Labrador and Golden retrievers.
- If excessive licking and/or scratching does occur, your animal may need an Elizabethan collar, spraying with Bitter Apple, or the use of some other type of deterrent.
- Please contact our office if you observe:
 - Excessive swelling or tenderness
 - Discharge lasting more then 2 days
 - Pus or infection around the incision site
 - Heat on or around the incision site
 - Or if you have any questions at all!
- Please reduce activity level, no jumping, rough-housing or stairs for 5-7 days.
